



There is nothing quite like the Lady Mayor's Show – the oldest civic procession in the world and the noisiest, largest and most colourful event in the City of London's calendar. Dating back more than 800 years, the Show celebrates the extraordinary 'ordinary' people of the Square Mile's broad and diverse community of residents, workers and visitors.

The three-mile long procession is a snapshot of the City combining tradition and pageantry with the modern, business City that is focussed on the future: from the military bands and ancient livery companies to the floats representing world-leading firms and vital community groups, charities and overseas organisations. It's the City in one day with something to entertain everyone. It's unique, unexpected and joyous, and is never the same twice.

Some 7,000 participants, 250 horses and over 50 decorated floats will travel from The Mansion House to the Royal Courts of Justice and back with the centrepiece being the gold State Coach carrying the Lady Mayor – showing herself to the people, which was the original purpose of the Show, along with swearing the Oath of Allegiance to the Sovereign at the Royal Courts of Justice.

So come along and be part of a spectacular procession that connects the traditions of London's past to the modernday world: a Show that represents the best of London – its diversity, its community, its culture and its history. The Lady Mayor's Show is the soul of London.


